Family Fun Day at the Telford Steam Railway

Sunday 19th July 2015

The Parish Council has agreed to sponsor a Family Fun Day at the Telford Steam Railway, Horsehay, on Sunday 19th July 2015. Family tickets (two adults and two children) will be available, free of charge, upon application, to those parents or guardians of children who reside in the Parish of Dawley Hamlets.

This new initiative by the Parish Council is designed to encourage an awareness of the history and facilities available for families with young children to enjoy within their own Parish. The history of Telford Horsehay Steam Trust (THST) can be traced back to mid-1972 when, as part of the Spring Village landscaping scheme. Telford Development Corporation (TDC) formulated the idea of purchasing and restoring a steam locomotive for display in the former Horsehay Company's loco shed.

It took until 1976 for the chain of events to take place that led to the formation of Telford Horsehay Steam Trust. Work soon started on restoring locomotive 5619 to working order and eventually several open days were held at the loco shed. When BR closed its rail link to the adjoining AB Cranes factory, TDC purchased the line from Lightmoor to Horsehay, leasing half the half-mile Horsehay to Heath Hill section to THST. The steam railway was opened to the public in 1984. Since then, THST has changed its name to Telford Steam Railway and consolidated its site, adding more rolling stock, a narrow gauge tramway, model railway and many site improvements.

I was lucky enough to be brought up close to the coast and during summer holidays from school we would cycle the 14 or so miles to the beach just to swim, play and lie in the sun. Do you remember the knitted swimming togs? Then the girls wore the more refined knitted swimming costumes. Oh dear! They caused a lot of innocent laughter.

We would dine on soggy tomato sandwiches slightly toasted from being in the sun. Otherwise it was egg sandwiches. These again were slightly toasted and warm from being out in the sun. We drank orange squash or lemon barley water again warmed by the sun. How delicious it all was! Some days we might have had the luxury of a bar of melted chocolate. Of course they were the small 2d bar. Now for all you clever ones I challenge you to convert that to our present currency.

We had strict instructions to be home at a particular time. Rarely did we push the boundaries to find out what would happen if we were late. However, it happened that my younger brother got severely sunburnt on the back of his legs and it was too painful for him to ride his bike. And so we virtually walked all the way home. It made us very late, incurring Dad's wrath. In hindsight it was an expression of relief that we were safe. One of the rare times that I challenged Dad. Yet my challenge calmed him.

Am I dreaming or is it true that those summer days were hotter and longer?

Then there were those lovely summer Sundays when the family went on the excursion train to the coast. Wonderful because Dad could be with us. His only day off. One of us would always stick our head out the carriage window and get soot in our eyes from the engine fire. My memory is that it was very painful. Once again we would have a picnic on the beach. Never to be forgotten is the sand in sandwiches. Nowadays we would travel by car and our picnic and drinks would be in a chilled "Cooler Box". Such luxury.

I also remember the summer visits to a friend's farm. Great fun days playing in the meadows and the orchard. I have never tasted apples like them since. Watching the cows being milked and then putting the milk through the separator to extract the cream. Then churning the cream to make absolutely delicious butter.

Sometimes we would be given a block of butter to take home for Mum and Dad.

The fantastic farmhouse teas before we set off for home, very tired but deliriously happy.

Today we simply go to the corner shop or the supermarket.

I visited the Acton Scott Farm Museum with my children some years ago and saw in use the farm equipment and tools of my youth.

The thought went through my mind, "I am now a museum piece." Perhaps my children agree!!


Up to date minutes are usually placed on the web site within days of them being approved, by Council, as a true record of the proceedings. http://dawley-hamlets.org

If this planning application affects you, or you have a view which you wish to be taken into consideration by the Planning Officers of the Borough Council then it is important that you convey that opinion directly to the relevant authority (which is Telford & Wrekin Council). The Parish Council is unable to "pass on" the views of others to the Planning Authority but it may take into account the views of residents of the Parish when deciding upon its own position on any particular application.
