#### 01/85 APOLOGIES

Apologies were received from Cllr. Chetwood, Cllr. Pritchard and Cllr. Mrs. Swain.

#### 01/86 STROWP

Bob gave the meeting details of Orders made to extinguish the old, and define the new, routes on the golf course. The meeting received a definitive map outlining the changes. Cllr Jeffs stated that he was expecting the Bridleway to go under the bridge and link up with the way on the Simon site. The route had been discussed and agreed with Mick Duce.

Bob stated that there was foot access under the bridge but the golf club would not allow horses onto the car park. He stated that he was trying to find some paper work to enforce the original agreement. Cllr. Woodvine stated that the route needed to link up for horse riders, otherwise it would be useless.

Bob replied that the owners had agreed access for pedestrians under the bridge and through the car park and when the land fill site is full, a path will be put in place to link up, but there was at present an enpass on the issue of allowing horses through the car park.

Cllr. Jeffs reminded Bob that there had been an initial agreement on these matters way back at the beginning when all those involved attended a full meeting.

Bob informed the meeting that the facilities of the golf club were available to all walkers.

Cllr. Jeffs asked if there could be an alternative way to solve the matter of the Bridleway link up. Bob replied that there may be a way forward when the landfill site is full and landscaping takes place.

Cllr. Jeffs stated that the Parish Council was not happy with the present situation or with vague promises of a possible solution. The Council was most concerned that there was no link and would continue to press for a complete link.

Bob highlighted the problem at the south end where a resident had objected to the closure of the defunct footpath (124).

Cllr. Gibson asked Bob to remind Mick Duce that he had made promises to have the hedge at Horsehay Common trimmed. Bob agreed to speak to Mr. Duce.

01/87 Minutes of the meeting held on 3rd September 2001

The Minutes of the meeting held on 3rd September 2001 were approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

01/89 Items Pending

a) B.V.T.

There were no matters to report on the matter of BVT. They had been informed that the council was willing to be shown comparative sites and this was being arranged.

b) War Memorial Site

The Clerk reported that the work had taken place to restore the surface of the war memorial, the land outside the gates had been surfaced and the litter bin put in place. Cllr. Jeffs commented that the site was now looking splendid. However, he had thought that the plans had included the provision of bollards. The Clerk explained that the contractor had been asked to delay the bollards until after the Remembrance Day ceremony and in the mean time, contact the Greenwood Trust to order specially made bollards. The Clerk agreed to confirm these arrangements with the contractor.

01/90 TRAFFIC MATTERS

Cllr. Jeffs gave a summary report of the meetings between T&WC officers, the Parish Council and residents. He informed the meeting that there was an overwhelming anti road hump feeling among the residents and it looked very much as though this was an option which could not be considered. The ideal solution, it would seem, would be to close the road at the Travellers Joy. If this happened, there would be no need to worry about traffic calming.

Cllr. Gibson asked that, if it was found that the road could not be blocked off, consideration be given to prohibiting heavy goods vehicles.

The meeting agreed that T&WC should be given a strong indication that the preference was that the road be blocked off with the turning point being in the area of the Travellers Joy.

01/91 Aqueduct Community Centre

The meeting agreed that the schedule of dilapidation should be discussed at the main meeting of the council.

Jeffs asked if the council had heard what had happened to the Village Hall committees "Millennium Quilt" he felt sure that the council had given £200 for the quilt to be framed, but it had not, as far as he was aware, been framed and was not on public display. The Clerk confirmed that a grant had been made.

Cllr. Jeffs stated that he would check with Mrs. Weston what the Committee intended to do with the quilt and how had, or was, the council's donation to be used.
