THE AQUEDUCT BRIDGE - AN UPDATE



Local distinctiveness and celebration of our heritage are both very important to me and for a long while I have looked on in sadness as the canal bridge that gives our ward part of its name has sat forlorn under cladding. Since coming into office, I have made it my mission to get things moving on the restoration of the bridge, securing the support of both Historic England and the Georgian Group in moving things forward. I am pleased to announce that the first tentative steps are finally underway. For those unfamiliar with the history of the bridge, it is a sandstone aqueduct, originally built to carry the newly-dug Shropshire Canal over the turnpike road from Bridgnorth to Wellington. Unlike our other historic bridges, the Aqueduct has the unique privilege of serving as a war memorial. Initial investigations on the bridge in the form of laser surveys took place in December. These will help determine the extent and nature of restoration works needed. This is going to be a very big project, and will require considerable funding. Officers and contractors have been working very hard to get this far, and I'm very encouraged by this first step. I have asked officers to put up notices should the paths need to be closed at any time and to explain why. Should you notice any antisocial behaviour or suspicious activity around the site, please don't hesitate to ring 111 and to get in touch with me or one of my colleagues. I have been assured that the site is inspected regularly to make sure it remains stable and safe.

FRIENDS OF HORSEHAY POOL & ENVIRONS - LATEST NEWS!

Last December we put in a bid for £15000 under a Central Government 'Pocket Park' scheme to improve the area near to the Pool inlet, i.e. north of the Pool by the picnic area and foot bridges. Our aim is to create small wetland areas that can retain water and be planted with trees, reeds and wildflowers and thereby help the wildlife. Also included are improvements to the footpaths and seating areas and we have been successful. The Parish Council have pledged an additional £4500 towards the scheme and the Friends will be supplementing funding with £2000 from our own funds. We are now scoping the work that needs to be done and will be carrying out consultation regarding the full detail of the scheme as soon as it is possible. We will begin by installing an improved, dry footpath through the picnic area. We are also progressing with our long-awaited Management Plan which is a strategic document that will determine the short, medium and long-term development, management and maintenance of the Pool and surrounding areas.

DEFIBRILLATORS IN THE PARISH

Aqueduct regulars at The Britannia Inn were able to purchase a defibrillator for the community through their charitable work this Christmas. The pub asked for donations for a Christmas Raffle and collected some great prizes from their locals that were raffled off throughout December. The pub also received some generous donations and by Christmas had collected £1800. The defibrillator was purchased in January, it is sited on the front wall of the pub and can be accessed by an emergency call to 999. It is a fantastic resource for the community. A defibrillator shock to a heart in cardiac arrest given as quickly as it can may save someone's life. The machine cleverly assesses the patient and talks the operator through procedures in an easy to understand way. The defibrillator is in a secure cabinet and is looked after by the licensees of the Britannia Inn, Andy & Mandy Powney. It is registered online on The Circuit database which is a defibrillator database in the U.K. and used by the NHS. Andy & Mandy said they are very proud of all the generosity and charity that their pub regulars give to different causes and it is also an honour to be guardians of such a valuable piece of life saving equipment.
