Local craftsman Nathan Morris impressed us with his 'Little Library' in Horsehay so much so that we commissioned one for Little Dawley too; these allowed local residents to continue with reading through the pandemic and local children to have a chance to visit for new reading materials.

VE Day was another highlight with many residents celebrating in style with a tea party; Cllr Kate Barnes created red, white and blue bunting to decorate the memorial.

As we entered Autumn and Winter, events continue to change slightly as different measures are in force; Dawley Hamlets Parish Council laid wreaths this year as normal at the Aqueduct and Little Dawley war memorials but, due to Coronavirus restrictions, no formal services were held.

DOSELEY CHURCHYARD LYCHGATE RESTORATION

In 2000 Dawley Hamlets Parish Council arranged for a new lychgate to be installed at the entrance to the burial ground at St Luke's Church in Doseley. By the beginning of 2020 the lychgate was looking rather the worse for wear and in need of some TLC. One of the main Oak pieces at the front had been damaged, the wooden shingles on top had started to rot, the gates needed maintenance and the whole structure was beginning to disappear under a mass of ivy.

The Parish Council were considering how to arrange repairs when we were contacted by Shaun Pickering who lives nearby and has relatives buried in the churchyard. As a carpenter Shaun offered to restore the lychgate and was interested in being involved in other improvements. It is fair to say that the whole churchyard, although it is in an attractive setting with mature trees around it, was beginning to look overgrown and neglected.

I met Shaun at the churchyard in early July and we made plans for getting the restoration of the lychgate and other work done. That work has continued and the lychgate is nearing completion. As a bonus Shaun has also made a handsome noticeboard and while he was fitting that by the gate I was able to give the bins a good clean and reposition them. A bin store to make them less obtrusive is also on the plans.

A good start has been made and we are keen to do more. A traditional stone wall surrounds the churchyard but it is mostly hidden by ivy. This needs clearing and the wall will need repairing. We hope to start on the wall nearest to St Luke's Road and also to reinstate the path next to it.

Doseley churchyard is an important place in the community and many residents will have a personal connection with it. Our intention is to restore its natural beauty, ensure it retains its atmosphere of peace and tranquillity and maintain it in a way that respects the memory of the loved ones who are commemorated there.
